### ORDER APPROVING SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

On June 30, 2023, Upper Peninsula Power Company (UPPCo) filed an application for approval of the company's energy waste reduction plan for the 2024 and 2025 calendar years.

A prehearing conference was held on August 16, 2023, before Administrative Law Judge Christopher S. Saunders (ALJ), at which the ALJ granted intervention to the Michigan Department of Attorney General and Billerud Americas Corporation. UPPCo and the Commission Staff also participated in the proceeding. Subsequently, the parties submitted a settlement agreement resolving all the issues in the case.

The Commission has reviewed the settlement agreement and finds that the public interest is adequately represented by the parties that entered into the settlement agreement. The Commission

further finds that the settlement agreement is in the public interest, represents a fair and reasonable resolution of the proceeding, and should be approved.

### THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- A. The settlement agreement, attached as Exhibit A, is approved.
- B. Within 30 days of the date of this order, Upper Peninsula Power Company shall file a tariff sheet in this docket substantially similar to Attachment 1 of the settlement agreement.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, pursuant to MCL 462.26. To comply with the Michigan Rules of Court's requirement to notify the Commission of an appeal, appellants shall send required notices to both the Commission's Executive Secretary and to the Commission's Legal Counsel. ### **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

Pursuant to Section 78 of the Administrative Procedures Act of 1969, as amended, MCL 24.278 ("APA") and Rule 431 of the Michigan Administrative Hearings and Rules, R 792.10431, Upper Peninsula Power Company ("UPPCO" or the "Company"), Attorney General Dana Nessel ("AG"), Billerud Americas Corporation ("Billerud"), and the Michigan Public Service Commission Staff ("Staff") agree as follows:

- 1. On December 21, 2022, the Michigan Public Service Commission ("MPSC" or the "Commission") issued its order in Case No. U-21320 et al., directing UPPCO to file its biennial energy waste reduction ("EWR") plan for 2024 and 2025.
- 2. Consistent with the Commission's December 21, 2023 order, on June 30, 2023, UPPCO filed its application, direct testimony, and exhibits in this case. This filing, among other things, included UPPCO's plan for providing EWR programs (including low income) to its customers, explained how those programs will be administered, specified the funding necessary for its plan, identified energy savings target, and demonstrated how the EWR costs, including incentive payments, would be recovered in rates for 2024-2025.

- 3. On July 7, 2023, the Commission's Executive Secretary issued the Notice of Hearing in the case directing the Company to mail a copy of the Notice to all cities, incorporated villages, townships, and counties in its service territory, as well as intervenors in Case Nos. U-21286 and U-20879. Further, the Company was directed to publish the Notice of Hearing in daily newspapers of general circulation throughout its service area. Consistent with those directives, on July 28, 2023, UPPCO filed its affidavits of mailing and publication with the Commission.
- 4. On August 16, 2023, a prehearing conference was held before Administrative Law Judge Christopher Saunders and counsel for the Company and Staff was in attendance. The petitions to intervene of the AG and Billerud were granted.
- 5. The Staff conducted a thorough review of the Company's June 30, 2023 filing specifically assessing the feasibility of the implementation, the cost-effectiveness of the programs, and the savings levels projected by the Company in its plan. The outcome of this review led to settlement discussions, whereat, the Staff requested the Company to remove financial incentive mechanism payments from its proposed plan surcharge calculation, in favor of recovering these incentive payments in the annual EWR reconciliation process.
  - 6. As the result of the settlement discussion, the parties hereby agree to the following:
- a. UPPCO's filed biennial EWR plan for 2024 and 2025 is reasonable, prudent, meets all requirements of 2008 PA 295 as amended by 2016 PA 342, and should be approved.
- b. The biennial EWR plan for 2024 and 2025 and related budget reflect energy saving targets that support an emphasis of investment in long life measures and low-income spending.

- c. The Commission should approve the continuation of UPPCO's financial incentive mechanism.
- d. The calculated plan surcharges, as set forth in Attachment 1 hereto, reflect the removal of estimated financial incentive mechanism payments with the understanding that such incentive payments will be addressed and recovered through the Company's annual EWR reconciliation process. Further, the Commission should approve the surcharges set forth in Attachment 1 to be effective on and after January 1, 2024.
- 7. All of the signatories are of the opinion that this settlement agreement is reasonable, prudent, in the public interest, and will aid in the expeditious conclusion of this case.
- 8. This settlement agreement is entered into for the sole and express purpose of reaching a compromise among the parties. All offers of settlement and discussions relating to this settlement are considered privileged under MRE 408. If the Commission approves this settlement agreement without modification, neither the parties to the settlement nor the Commission shall make any reference to, or use this settlement agreement or the order approving it, as a reason, authority, rationale or example for taking any action or position or making any subsequent decision in any other case or proceeding; provided, however, such references may be made to enforce or implement the provisions of this settlement agreement and the order approving it.
- 9. Pursuant to Rule 431(6) of the Michigan Administrative Hearing System's Administrative Rules, R 792.1043(6) the parties agree any order approving this settlement agreement shall not establish precedent for future unrelated proceedings. This settlement agreement is based on the facts and circumstances of this case and is intended as the final disposition of Case No. U-21325 only. If the Commission approves this settlement agreement,

without modification, the undersigned parties agree not to appeal, challenge or, otherwise, contest the Commission order approving this settlement agreement only.

- 10. This settlement agreement is not severable. Each provision of this settlement agreement is dependent upon all other provisions of this settlement agreement. Failure to comply with any provision of this settlement agreement constitutes failure to comply with the entire settlement agreement. If the Commission rejects or modifies this settlement agreement or any provision of this settlement agreement, this settlement agreement shall be deemed to be withdrawn, shall not constitute any part of the record in this proceeding or be used for any other purpose, and shall not operate to prejudice the pre-negotiation positions of any party.
- 11. The parties agree to waive Section 81 of the Administrative Procedures Act of 1969 (MCL 24.281), as it applies to the issues in this proceeding if the Commission approves this settlement agreement without modification.

### Energy Waste Reduction Surcharge

This surcharge permits, pursuant to Section 91(4) of 2008 Pa 295, and as amended in 2016 PA 342, the adjustment of distribution rates, via the application of an Energy Waste Reduction Surcharge, to allow recovery of the energy waste reduction alternative compliance payment made by the Company in compliance with Section 91(1) of 2008 Pa 295 as amended in 2016 PA 342.

All customer bills subject to the provisions of this tariff, including any bills rendered under special contract, shall be adjusted by the Energy Waste Reduction Surcharge per kWh or per meter, per day as follows:
