ORDER

On October 31, 2024, National Gas & Electric, LLC (NGE) applied for a license to operate as an alternative gas supplier (AGS) in Michigan pursuant to Public Act 634 of 2002, MCL 460.9 *et seq.* (Act 634). As part of its application, NGE provided information to demonstrate compliance with the AGS license requirements set forth in Act 634 and the Commission’s March 12, 2003 order in Case No. U-13694 (March 12 order) establishing the AGS licensing procedure.

Act 634 requires an AGS to have the necessary financial, managerial, and technical capabilities to serve customers within the state of Michigan.¹ In accordance with the March 12 order, the Commission Staff (Staff) must review the application of the prospective AGS for conformance with Act 634 and with the Commission’s orders. The Staff then must recommend appropriate action regarding that application to the Commission.

The Staff has reviewed NGE's license application and information, as well as the history of its affiliates. Based on this review, the Staff recommends that NGE be granted a license to operate as an AGS in Michigan.

NGE currently provides electricity to approximately 33,000 customers in Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Ohio, Maryland, Illinois, New Jersey, Rhode Island, and Texas.

Upon review of NGE's personnel descriptions and histories, the Staff observed that NGE's key personnel have extensive experience in the energy industry. The Staff also found that NGE is able to respond to customer inquiries and complaints in a timely manner through its current customer assistance group. Based on its review, the Staff has determined that NGE has sufficient experience and expertise to serve customers in Michigan's Gas Customer Choice Program. The Commission agrees.

NGE provided the Staff with a bond in the amount of \$100,000. Based on its review of the audited consolidated financial statements and the satisfied bond requirement, the Staff determined that NGE's financial capabilities and availability meet Act 634 requirements. The Commission agrees.

Act 634 requires NGE to maintain an office within the state of Michigan.² NGE's Michigan office is located at 3410 Belle Chase Way, Suite 230, Lansing, MI 48911. The Staff determined that NGE has met the office requirements for licensing. The Commission agrees.

The Staff's review of NGE's application also included a review of formal complaints or investigations, energy-related penalties and fines, and any energy violations of law and business ethics in the other eight states in which NGE holds a license to supply electricity. Currently, there are no open lawsuits or formal complaints.

Based on NGE's submissions and the Staff's review, the Commission finds that NGE's request to be licensed as an AGS is reasonable and in the public interest and should be approved. The Commission finds that the AGS license should be conditioned upon compliance with all applicable provisions of Act 634, the Commission's orders and administrative rules, and each of the delivering natural gas utilities' tariffs. Failure to comply with any of these provisions may result in revocation of the license or other penalties.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- A. National Gas & Electric, LLC, is granted a license as an alternative gas supplier.
- B. National Gas & Electric, LLC, shall comply with the regulatory requirements specified in Public Act 634 of 2002, MCL 460.9 *et seq.*; the Commission's orders and administrative rules; and each of the delivering natural gas utilities' tariffs.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, pursuant to MCL 462.26. To comply with the Michigan Rules of Court's requirement to notify the Commission of an appeal, appellants shall send required notices to both the Commission's Executive Secretary and to the Commission's Legal Counsel.


