ORDER

On November 28, 2023, Governor Gretchen Whitmer signed into law Public Act 235 of 2023 (Act 235), which amended Public Act 295 of 2008 and Public Act 342 of 2016 (Act 342). The amendments were effective on February 27, 2024. Section 173(3) of Act 235 increased the size of Michigan's distributed generation (DG) program from 1% of an electric utility's or alternative electric supplier's average in-state peak load for the preceding five calendar years to 10% of the average in-state peak load for the preceding five calendar years, and included other changes to the DG program. MCL 460.1173(3). Section 177 of Act 235 addressed metering and billing associated with the DG program.

On February 8, 2024, the Commission issued an order in Case No. U-21569 (February 8 order) seeking comment from interested persons on three aspects of the statutory changes resulting from Act 235 which are described below. February 8 order, pp. 2-5. The February 8 order set

dates for the filing of initial and reply comments on these three issues and any other relevant matters. *Id.*, p. 5.

On March 26, 2024, initial comments were filed by DTE Electric Company (DTE Electric); Consumers Energy Company (Consumers); Michigan Energy Innovation Business Council and Advanced Energy United (together, MEIU); the Ecology Center, Environmental Law & Policy Center, Union of Concerned Scientists, and Vote Solar; Great Lakes Renewable Energy Association (GLREA); Indiana Michigan Power Company (I&M); and the Michigan Electric and Gas Association (MEGA). On April 16, 2024, reply comments were filed by DTE Electric, Consumers, MEIU, GLREA, and MEGA. One public comment was filed in the Case Comments section of the docket by Adam Schaller on behalf of Lakeshore Die Cast.

On July 23, 2024, the Commission issued an order in Case Nos. U-21569 and U-21767 (July 23 order) summarizing the comments received and making the following findings:

1. There is no requirement for the use of a generation meter for certified projects under 150 kilowatts (kW), and that utilities should be allowed to make a determination as to the need for a generation meter on a case-by-case basis for certified projects larger than 150 kW and for non-certified projects larger than 20 kW. Therefore, a waiver was granted to the rate regulated electric utilities from the provisions of Mich Admin Code, R 460.1014(2) and Mich Admin Code, R 460.1014(2)(c) that require the utilization of a generation meter.
2. A DG customer's bill credit can be used to offset the total charges on the customer's bill, except that DG outflow credits cannot be used to offset securitization charges that appear on the customer's bill.
3. The size of a renewable energy system eligible for the DG program is limited to 110% of the customer's electricity consumption for the previous 12 months and the aggregate eligible generator capacity at a single site is limited to no more than 550 kW.
4. Each rate regulated electric utility should file an *ex parte* application for approval of a revised DG tariff that is compliant with the provisions of Act 235 and the July 23 order.

Subsequently, and in compliance with the July 23 order, the rate-regulated utilities filed respective applications for *ex parte* approval of their revised DG tariffs as follows: Alpena Power Company (Alpena) filed on September 20, 2024, in Case No. U-21794; Consumers filed on September 20, 2024, in Case No. U-21796; DTE Electric filed on September 20, 2024, in Case No. U-21798; Indiana Michigan Power Company (I&M) filed on September 20, 2024, in Case No. U-21795; Northern States Power Company (NSP) filed on September 17, 2024, in Case No. U-21793; Upper Michigan Energy Resources Corporation (UMERC) filed on September 18, 2024, in Case No. U-21790; and Upper Peninsula Power Company (UPPCo) filed on September 19, 2024, in Case No. U-21791.

The Commission Staff (Staff) reviewed each of the utilities' applications and accompanying revised DG tariffs and made revisions as necessary to ensure that each DG tariff aligned with the provisions of Act 235 and the July 23 order. The Staff worked with each rate-regulated utility to reach an agreement on the proposed revisions. The above-captioned utilities then filed amended applications in their respective dockets with updated DG tariff sheets to include any revisions proposed by the Staff, with Alpena filing on November 8, 2024; Consumers filing on December 13, 2024; DTE Electric filing on November 1, 2024; I&M filing on October 28, 2024; NSP filing on December 2, 2024; UMERC filing on December 2, 2024; and UPPCo filing on December 17, 2024.

The edits proposed by the Staff vary depending upon each rate-regulated utility's initially filed DG tariff, but the Staff's changes encompassed the following general issues:

- Defining the Category sizes within the program.
 - Category 1 includes projects of 20 kW or smaller.
 - Category 2 includes projects greater than 20kW but not more than 550 kW
 - References to Category 3 and methane digesters were removed, as they are no longer relevant given the changes in Act 235.

- Correctly addressing the allocations of available program space as not less than 50% reserved for Category 1 projects and not more than 50% for Category 2 projects.
- Appropriately addressing the application of customer outflow credits and the accrual of any unused credit carried to be carried forward to the next billing cycle.
- Updating the definitions for “renewable energy resources” to reflect the language in Act 235.

Having reviewed the updated tariffs filed in response to the collaboration with the Staff, the Commission finds that the updated tariffs filed by Alpena, Consumers, DTE Electric, I&M, UMERC, and UPPCo are compliant with the requirements of Act 235 and the July 23 order and should be approved.

With respect to NSP’s initial application and amended application, the Commission notes that NSP included requests for approvals of its tariff sheets D-47.50 and D-47.70. NSP also filed updated DG tariff sheets in Case No. U-21455, a docket pertaining to interconnection procedures pursuant to the Interconnection and Distributed Generation Standards, Mich Admin Code, R 460.901a *et seq.* NSP has also filed an application in Case No. U-21819, a docket pertaining to NSP’s compliance with the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978, PL 95–617; 92 Stat 3117, and included in that application changes to the D-47.50 and D-47.70 tariff sheets that are not consistent with the changes the utility requested in the instant docket. Due to the discrepancy between the requested changes in this docket and those in Case No. U-21455 and Case No. U-21819, the Commission finds that approval of NSP’s updated DG tariff sheets, except for tariff sheets D-47.50 and D-47.70, is appropriate in this case. Approval of tariff sheets D-47.50 and D-47.70 will be addressed in Case No. U-21819. Therefore, the Commission finds that NSP’s amended application filed on December 2, 2024 in Case No. U-21793, should be approved in part and denied in part.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

- A. The amended applications filed by Alpena Power Company, Consumers Electric Company, DTE Electric Company, Indiana Michigan Power Company, Upper Michigan Energy Resources Corporation, and Upper Peninsula Power Company requesting *ex parte* approval of their respective updated distributed generation tariffs are approved, as described in this order.
- B. The amended application filed by Northern States Power Company requesting *ex parte* approval of its updated distributed generation tariff is approved in part, and denied in part, as described in this order.
- C. Within 30 days from the date of this order, each above-captioned rate-regulated utility shall file in its assigned docket its respective tariff sheets substantially similar to those included with its amended application and as approved in this order. After the tariff sheets have been reviewed and accepted by Commission Staff for inclusion in the companies' tariff books, each rate-regulated utility shall promptly file the final tariff sheets in its assigned docket and serve all parties.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, pursuant to MCL 462.26. To comply with the Michigan Rules of Court's requirement to notify the Commission of an appeal, appellants shall send required notices to both the Commission's Executive Secretary and to the Commission's Legal Counsel. 
