**ORDER APPROVING SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

On September 30, 2025, Upper Peninsula Power Company (UPPCo) filed an application in this docket, with supporting testimony and exhibits, seeking authority to implement a power supply cost recovery (PSCR) plan and factors for the 12-month period ending December 31, 2026, pursuant to Section 6j of Public Act 304 of 1982, MCL 460.6j. UPPCo also seeks approval to recover, through the PSCR mechanism, prudently incurred actual costs and credits associated with financial transmission rights.

A prehearing conference was held on November 19, 2025, before Administrative Law Judge Theresa A.G. Staley. UPPCo and the Commission Staff participated in the proceeding. Subsequently, the parties filed a settlement agreement resolving all issues in this case.

The Commission has reviewed the settlement agreement and finds that the public interest is adequately represented by the parties who entered into the settlement agreement. The Commission further finds that the settlement agreement is in the public interest, represents a fair and reasonable resolution of the proceeding, and should be approved.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

A. The settlement agreement, attached as Exhibit A, is approved.

B. Within 30 days of the date of this order, Upper Peninsula Power Company shall file with the Commission a tariff sheet substantially similar to Attachment 1 to the settlement agreement. After the tariff sheet has been reviewed and accepted by the Commission Staff for inclusion in the company's tariff book, Upper Peninsula Power Company shall promptly file the final tariff sheet in this docket and serve all parties.

The Commission reserves jurisdiction and may issue further orders as necessary.

Any party desiring to appeal this order must do so in the appropriate court within 30 days after issuance and notice of this order, pursuant to MCL 462.26. To comply with the Michigan Rules of Court's requirement to notify the Commission of an appeal, appellants shall send required notices to both the Commission's Executive Secretary and to the Commission's Legal Counsel.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

As provided in § 78 of the Administrative Procedures Act of 1969 (“APA”), as amended, MCL 24.278, and Rule 431 of the Michigan Administrative Hearing System’s Administrative Hearing Rules, 2015 ACR 792.10431, Upper Peninsula Power Company (“UPPCO” or the “Company”) and the Michigan Public Service Commission Staff (“Staff”) hereby agree as follows:

1. On September 30, 2025, UPPCO filed with the Michigan Public Service Commission (“Commission”) its Application, along with the testimony and exhibits of its witness, Nicole E. Bell, to: (i) implement a Power Supply Cost Recovery (“PSCR”) plan and PSCR factors for the 2026 calendar year, (ii) continue to recover through the PSCR the costs and credits associated with Financial Transmission Rights (“FTR”), and (iii) submit its five-year forecast of power supply requirements, anticipated sources of supply and projections of power supply costs.

2. On October 20, 2025, the Commission’s Executive Secretary issued a Notice of Hearing directing UPPCO to mail a copy of the Notice of Hearing to all cities, incorporated villages, townships, and counties in its service area, as well as to intervenors in Case Nos. U-21602, U-21433, U-21555, and U-20276. The Commission further directed UPPCO to publish

the Notice of Hearing in newspapers of general circulation throughout its service area. Complying with the directives, UPPCO electronically filed with the Commission the requisite Affidavit of Mailing and Proofs of Publication on November 6, 2025.

3. On November 19, 2025, a prehearing conference was held with Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) Theresa A. G. Staley presiding and Staff entered its appearance. There were no intervenors.

4. The Staff conducted an analysis of the PSCR plan and the decisions underlying that plan. Staff’s review found UPPCO’s 2026 PSCR plan is consistent with past Commission approvals and based on reasonable projections. Staff also updated the prior period under-recovery to the year-end amount of \$4,306,192 for purposes of calculating the 2026 PSCR factors.

5. The parties have negotiated the terms of this Settlement Agreement and agree as follows:

- a. As based on Staff’s audit, UPPCO’s 2026 PSCR plan is reasonable and should be approved by the Commission.
- b. Upon Commission approval of this Settlement Agreement, UPPCO should be authorized to implement a ceiling PSCR factor of \$0.02342 per kWh in its retail electric customers’ monthly bills for the 12-month period through the December 2026 billing month. A tariff sheet, attached as Attachment 1, reflects the recommended factor.
- c. UPPCO’s 5-year forecast of power supply requirements meets the statutory mandates of 1982 PA 304 and should be accepted for filing.

d. The parties agree that it is reasonable for the Commission to allow for the recovery through the PSCR mechanism of prudently incurred actual costs and credits associated with use of FTR.

6. The signatories are of the opinion that this Settlement Agreement is reasonable, is in the public interest and will aid in the expeditious conclusion of this case.

7. This Settlement Agreement is entered into for the sole and express purpose of reaching a compromise among the positions of the parties and avoiding further litigation in Case No. U-21883. This Settlement Agreement is intended for a final disposition of this proceeding, and the parties join in respectfully requesting that the Commission grant prompt approval. The parties agree not to appeal, challenge, or contest the Commission's Order accepting and approving this Settlement Agreement without modification. If the Commission does not accept the Settlement Agreement without modification, the Agreement shall be withdrawn and shall not constitute any part of the record in this proceeding or be used for any other purpose whatsoever.

8. All offers of settlement and discussions relating to this Settlement Agreement are, and shall be considered, privileged under MRE 408 and shall not be used in any manner, or be admissible for any other purpose in connection with this proceeding or matter. This Settlement Agreement does not constitute a precedent in any other case or proceeding except as necessary to carry out its terms.

9. All signatories waive Section 81 of the APA of 1969, as amended, MCL 24.281, as it applies to the issues in this proceeding, providing the Commission approves the Settlement Agreement without modification.


