The rapid adoption of distributed generation systems and electric vehicle infrastructure and the potential impacts on the distribution system requires the need for further data collection, enhanced transparency of that data, and increased access to that data, in order to better assess and encourage the integration of distributed generation resources and electric vehicle infrastructure and integrating those technologies in a way that minimizes cost and reliability impacts on the distribution system and enhances efficient utilization of the electric grid. We are very excited to be able to kick off this effort, working with our partners the Department of Energy, as well as the National Renewable Energy Laboratory. We look forward to working with staff and stakeholders in order to perform and initiate some of the objectives outlined in this order today."

Finally, the decision today also does not impact either the process or timeline involved for the consideration of other necessary permits, including those under review by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. This has been an extensive process. We want to make sure that we get it right and that is the rationale behind reopening the record for the development of additional information in this matter."
