"I'd first like to thank all the parties who participated in this case, including our staff, Consumers Energy, and all of the interveners who, over the course of the last 9 months, worked through the many details of this case to negotiate an impressive agreement between 17 different parties, with an additional 3 signing statements of non-objection. As Ms. Champion noted, this settlement agreement would provide needed revenue to the company to repair and maintain dam infrastructure, clear trees from interfering with electric lines, transition the electric vehicle programs to a permanent program, and better involve customers in its decision-making process, with a focus on equity and environmental justice, among many other things. I commend the progress made by all the parties involved and am excited to witness the implementation of these programs in the years to come."
