Case No. U-18425 involves an application from Consumers Energy Company for *ex parte* approval of a new power purchase agreement with STS Hydropower, LLC for the output of the Ada Hydro Plant. The order before you approves the application. Commissioner Peretick moved that the Commission approve the order at its October 24, 2023 meeting. Commissioner Carreon seconded that motion.

Case No. U-20147 involves a matter, on the Commission's own motion, for certain regulated electric utilities to file their distribution investment and maintenance plans and for other related matters. The order before you establishes dates for the filing of comments on the most-recently filed distribution plans for Indiana Michigan Power Company, Consumers Energy Company, and DTE Electric Company. Commissioner Peretick moved that the Commission

approve the order at its October 24, 2023 meeting. Commissioner Carreon seconded that motion.

## **Commissioner Peretick commented:**

"I would just like to highlight the opportunity for public input on these 5-year electric distribution plans for DTE Electric, Consumers Energy, and Indiana Michigan Power in this order that is before us. We value the public's input and would like to build a robust record on the plans that were submitted. The due dates for comments for each of the companies' plans are staggered – I&M's comments are due January 19th, Consumers Energy's February 16th, and DTE's March 15th. I look forward to hearing from all interested parties."

3. U-21496 IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF DTE ELECTRIC COMPANY FOR ACCOUNTING APPROVAL TO ACCRUE AN ALLOWANCE FOR FUNDS USED DURING CONSTRUCTION ON CONSTRUCTION WORK IN PROGRESS FOR PROJECTS WITHIN ITS RENEWABLE ENERGY PLAN (ex parte/final order)

Case No. U-21496 involves an application filed by DTE Electric Company for *ex parte* approval to accrue an allowance for funds used during construction on construction work in progress for projects within the company's renewable energy plan. The order before you approves the application. Commissioner Peretick moved that the Commission approve the order at its October 24, 2023 meeting. Commissioner Carreon seconded that motion.

U-21502 IN THE MATTER, ON THE COMMISSION'S OWN MOTION, TO REQUIRE CONSUMERS ENERGY COMPANY TO SHOW CAUSE WHY IT SHOULD NOT BE FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THE CONSUMER STANDARDS AND BILLING PRACTICES FOR ELECTRIC AND NATURAL GAS SERVICE, MICH ADMIN CODE, R 460.101 ET SEQ., THE SERVICE QUALITY AND RELIABILITY STANDARDS FOR ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS, MICH

ADMIN CODE, R 460.701 *ET SEQ.*, AND THE TECHNICAL STANDARDS FOR GAS SERVICE, MICH ADMIN CODE, R 460.2301 *ET SEQ.* 

(show cause order)

Commission Staff Jake Thelen, Customer Assistance Division, presented a brief synopsis of the case listed above. Commissioner Peretick moved that the Commission approve the order at its October 24, 2023 meeting. Commissioner Carreon seconded that motion.

#### **Commissioner Peretick commented:**

"I would like to thank MPSC staff for their diligent work on this matter. A big thanks to Mr. Thelen and the whole Customer Assistance team who have investigated this and upheld the standards and rules that are in place to protect Michigan customers. I would also like to note the importance of public comment and complaints, and how critical public input has been to identifying and solving the issues addressed in this order. We learned of the multiple issues addressed here as a result of public comment at our town halls, informal questions and complaints to our Customer Assistance team, both in-person, over the phone, and through electronic means, and through the formal complaint process. Our Consumer Standards and Billing Practices and our Service Quality and Reliability Standards exist for a reason, and it is important that all our utilities in our state are meeting these standards. I look forward to resolving all the issues identified."

#### VI. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Coreen Strzalka read a letter that she submitted to ITC in Case No. U-21471 regarding installation of the proposed transmission line in Oneida Township.

Martha Kenyon, Eagle, provided comments regarding the alternate route transmission line proposed by ITC.

John Pung provided comments on behalf of his family farm regarding the proposed transmission line by ITC.

Karol Sanborn read a letter that her son wrote addressed to ITC and the proposed transmission line by ITC.

#### **Commissioner Peretick announced:**

"I wanted to notify folks of an upcoming grant opportunity. The Department of EGLE has recently released an RFP opportunity for funding under the IIJA Section 401010(d): "Preventing Outages and Enhancing the Resiliency of the Electric Grid Formula Grants to States and Indian Tribes." The State of Michigan's formula allocation for this initial phase of a multi-year grant from the DOE, is \$16.3 million to be available to eligible entities- including investor owned, municipal, and cooperatively owned utilities. The program goals are to fund grid hardening efforts, such as tree trimming, technology upgrades, microgrid opportunities, and more. The response to the RFP is due to EGLE by November 17th. More information can be found on the "Grid Resiliency Funding Opportunities" page on EGLE's website. I encourage all utilities to consider innovative projects for funding to increase the resilience of Michigan's electric grid."

## Chair Scripps announced:

"The Department of Energy, through that Grid Resilience and Innovation Partnerships program, recently made a series of awards totaling (I think) \$3.4 billion across the country, including \$100 million to Consumers Energy and (I believe) \$22 million to DTE for work to improve the resilience of the grid, as well as some regional awards. Kudos to both of those companies for pursuing successfully that funding. We are excited to see you put it to work.

The last piece, I know that all three of us are pretty excited over the football results over the weekend. I am talking, of course, the Rice Owls winning 42-10 over Tulsa and my alma Scott's winning 43-10 over Kalamazoo. Commissioner Peretick, I think your undergraduate institution did fairly well, as well."
