**NOTICE OF VIRTUAL PUBLIC TOWN HALL MEETING  
REGARDING THE POWER OUTAGES FOR ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS OCCURRING  
AFTER THE RECENT ICE AND SNOW STORMS**

- This **virtual** public town hall meeting is intended for electric customers to share their experiences during and after the recent ice and snow storms across the Lower Peninsula and to hear what steps the Michigan Public Service Commission is taking to address reliability.
- The meeting will be legislative in nature, and any person may present data and views during the public comment period.
- The meeting is open to the public, and the information below describes how a person may participate.
- The meeting is being held **remotely by video/teleconference**.

**DATE:** Tuesday, March 21, 2023

**TIME:** 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM

**PARTICIPATION:** The meeting is open to the public, and any interested person may participate by using the Microsoft Teams [meeting link](#), or by dialing (248) 509-0316 and entering the conference ID 543 844 361# when prompted.

Persons with disabilities needing any assistance or accommodation to participate should contact the Commission's Executive Secretary at (517) 284-8090 in advance of the meeting.

In the event of a disconnection caused by the meeting host, the public meeting will be in recess. Every effort will be made to reestablish a publicly accessible connection. If the host is unable to do so within 15 minutes from the time of the disconnection, the meeting will adjourn. The meeting will not recess or adjourn due to technical or other issues experienced by individual members of the public that render them unable to participate in the meeting. Members of the public who have intermittent internet service should consider listening to the meeting via telephone to avoid missing any part of the meeting.

Members of the public with disabilities also have the option to participate in this meeting by dialing 7-1-1 and using the Michigan Relay service. Persons participating via the Microsoft Teams Livestream may also turn on live captions.

This public meeting will be broadcast live using Microsoft Teams. For those wishing to view the meeting only, and not wishing to provide public comment, click the Microsoft live event [meeting link](#) at the start of the event.

Public Comment for the Meeting:

Members of the public who wish to make a comment may do so during the public comment portion of the meeting, subject to the following requirements. Comments should be limited to no longer than three (3) minutes; however, the Commission will manage the public comment process and may adjust or place further limits on how long a person may speak.

Public comments must be directed to the commissioners and should not be used to engage with other participants or respond to their comments. The public comment period is an opportunity for commissioners to listen to comments and concerns. Public comments should be limited to one per person.

*Public Comment Requests via Microsoft Teams*

If you would like to be queued up for verbal comments during the public meeting and have access to the Microsoft Teams meeting, you may do so using the raise hand function. You will find this at the top of the Teams meeting screen. You will be added to the list of participants seeking to provide comments. Commenters will be called upon in the order they request to speak.

*Public Comments via Phone Only*

For individuals participating by phone and who want to make verbal comments, you may press \*5 to be queued up for comment. When it is your turn to speak, press \*6 on your phone to unmute.

All attendees will be muted until called upon for public comment. When called upon, please unmute and indicate your name and the county where you live before beginning your public comment and limit your comments to no longer than 3 minutes.
