- Enbridge Energy, Limited Partnership (Enbridge) requests Michigan Public Service Commission to grant Enbridge the authority for its project known as the Straits Line 5 Replacement Segment, which involves constructing a replacement segment of the Line 5 pipeline that crosses the Straits of Mackinac.
- This notice of public hearing describes how a person may participate in this public hearing. The intent of this hearing is to inform the public about Enbridge's application, the Commission's role, the administrative process and timeline to be followed in Case No. <u>U-20763</u>, and to receive comments from the public. The public hearing will be legislative in nature and any person may present data and views regarding the application during the public comment period.

Public Comment for the Public Hearing:

Members of the public who wish to make a comment may do so during the public comment portion of the hearing, subject to the following requirements. Comments should be limited to no longer than three (3) minutes; however, the presiding officer will manage the public comment process and may adjust or place further limits on how long a person may speak.

Public comments must be directed to the Commission and should not be used to engage with other participants or respond to their comments. The public comment period is an opportunity for commissioners to listen to comments and concerns and not to answer questions. Public comments should be limited to one per person.

Please note that you can only make verbal comments during this public hearing by calling into the hearing using the phone number and conference ID identified in this notice.
