### Public Comments:

Members of the public who wish to make a comment may do so during the Public Comment portion of the meeting, pursuant to the Commission's bylaws. The public may also submit written comments to the Commission via email at [mpsc\\_commissioners@michigan.gov](mailto:mpsc_commissioners@michigan.gov).

The Commission will take public comments in the following order: first, individuals attending in person; and then, individuals participating remotely, either through Microsoft Teams or the phone, who have entered the speaker queue. For individuals attending in person and who want to make a public comment, you may fill out a comment card to assist in the process.

Public comments must be directed to the Commission and should not be used to engage with other participants or respond to their comments. The Public Comment period is an opportunity for commissioners to listen to comments and concerns and not to answer questions. Public comments are limited to three (3) minutes and one per person. When providing a comment, please indicate your name and where you live if you are willing to share.

The public may provide input on any business that will come before the Commission at the meeting or via email at [mpsc\\_commissioners@michigan.gov](mailto:mpsc_commissioners@michigan.gov). Public comments pertaining to a specific case should be submitted to [mpscdockets@michigan.gov](mailto:mpscdockets@michigan.gov).

### Public Comments by Remote Participation:

In addition to in-person public comments at the Commission meeting, members of the public may make public comments by Microsoft Teams or the phone.

For individuals participating remotely by Microsoft Teams and who want to make a verbal comment, you may click on the "raise hand" button to be queued up for comment. When it is your turn to speak, please click on the "mic" button to unmute. Individuals participating through Microsoft Teams also have the option to turn on their cameras.

For individuals participating remotely by phone and who want to make a verbal comment, you may press \*5 to be queued up for comment. When it is your turn to speak, press \*6 to unmute.

Public commenters on both Microsoft Teams and on the phone are added to the same speaker queue and will be called upon in the order they enter the speaker queue. Again, please do not lower your hand or press \*5 again or you will be removed from the queue and lose your place in line.
