ORDER TO ADMIT ADDITIONAL EVIDENCE

This case originally came before the Unemployment Insurance Appeals Commission (Commission) on a timely appeal by the Unemployment Insurance Agency (Agency) from an August 3, 2022 Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) decision. This case is now before the Commission pursuant to a Michigan Court of Appeals remand order via the Lenawee County Circuit Court. To properly address this matter, it is necessary to consider additional evidence.

Section 34(2) of the Act provides:

An appeal to the [Commission] from the findings of fact and decision of the administrative law judge or from a denial by the administrative law judge of a motion for a rehearing or reopening shall be a matter of right by an interested party. The [Commission] on the basis of evidence previously submitted and **additional evidence as it requires**, shall affirm, modify, set aside, or reverse the findings of fact and decision of the administrative law judge or a denial by the administrative law judge of a motion for rehearing or reopening. [Emphasis added.]

Mich Admin Code, R 792.11422(2), provides in pertinent part:

Absent an evidentiary hearing, the [Commission] shall mail a copy of any evidence it intends to introduce into the record to each party. The parties shall have 14 days thereafter to object to or refute such evidence.

The Commission contemplates making a document, described herein, part of the record in this matter in accordance with Mich Admin Code, R 792.11422(2), and Section 34(2) of the Act.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the following additional evidence, a copy of which is attached to this order, is hereby mailed to the parties, to allow for an opportunity to refute such evidence:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that objections or refutations (if any) to this additional evidence must be RECEIVED by the Commission within 14 days of the mailing date of this order, as noted below.


If the Commission receives timely objections or refutations, the Commission will consider them before deciding whether to admit the additional evidence into the record.

If the Commission does not receive timely objections or refutations, the additional evidence will be entered into the record and considered by the Commission in making its decision in this matter.

The Commission will issue a decision in this matter in due course.
